* To all Residents in Pathology - As a resident in either an osteopathic, or AOA-approved nonosteopathic training program in Pathology, you are required to submit documentation of each year of training to satisfy the minimum requirements for Board eligibility through the American Osteopathic Board of Pathology.

This documentation is to include a report from your program director, and a statistical report from you. In addition, at least one research paper/manuscript is to be submitted during the four years of training. Residents in osteopathic programs are to submit these documents directly to this College, and residents in nonosteopathic programs are to submit them to the AOA, who will in turn, forward them to the Evaluating Committee of the College.

Additionally, all residents in nonosteopathic programs, are to apply to the AOA for program approval. At the completion

of training, the AOA will designate a "Program Complete" to training, and you will be eligible to apply for Board Certification by the AOBP. Please submit your documents timely in order to be reviewed by the Evaluating Committee.

If you are a resident in a training program, and know of other residents in Pathology who have not been receiving mail from the College, please have them contact this office, and their names will be placed on our mailing list to receive future mailings.

This is a salaried position at the Southeastern Medical Center, Donald Bergmann, D.O., Director. This is a 225 bed osteopathic hospital, with intern training and residency programs in Internal Medicine, OB/GYN, Surgery, Ortho, and ER. The hospital is located in North Miami Beach, FL, and is the teaching hospital for Southeastern College of Osteopathic Medicine. An AMI hospital, Dr. Bergmann is a part of a ten man group (nine M.D.'s, one D.O., all board certified).

The next page is of particular importance for all residents. I would like to suggest that it is kept for reference, as it is a guide to the minimum requirements leading to board eligibility by the American Osteopathic Board of Pathologists, (ADBP).

It details the components, and contents of the "Annual Report" which is to be sent in by every resident in a pathology training program.

B.G. Mote, D.O. is a "regular" on the AOA hospital inspection survey team. In a note from him, he stated that the AOA is not reviewing laboratory proficiency test results in Chicago, and that some accredited hospitals have never had reports sent to the AOA.

Comment on this is that there is no one in the AOA that has the expertise to review the CAP survey results, and that they have had to rely on this being done by the surveyor at the time of an inspection. With this being the case, I would like to suggest that each laboratory director monitor his/her proficiency testing program results and document corrections in deficiencies. The HCFA (Health Care Financing Administration), a part of HHS, Bureau of Laboratories and Ambulatory Services is very much "alive and well", and still functioning. In fact, that office is in the process of rewriting the certification (standards) manuals and expect to have new Conditions of Participation within a relatively short time.

The new directory will be sent to the printer shortly. However, some of you may not be aware of the current slate of Officers, or members of various committees. In the interim, we submit the following:

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ATTENTION ALL RESIDENTS, ALL PROGRAM DIRECTORS
At the time of a telephone conference call of the Executive Committee of the ADCP, on April 6, 1985, it was determined that a set protocol would become effective as of that date, with regard to residents in Pathology. A flow chart describing the procedure is as follows:

- 1. The program director is to notify the College of all residents in his/her program.
- 2. The resident is then sent a letter welcoming him/her into the discipline of Pathology, and encouraging candidate membership in the College.
- 3. The resident is informed of the required reports during the four years of the residency, the investigative paper, and the need for submitting these in a timely manner, as training reports will be reviewed by the Evaluating Committee on a bi-annual basis.
- 4. The Board of Pathology will be notified at the completion of the training that the resident has successfully completed the training program, and is to be considered "Board eligible".

Shown below, is the new residency training "track", now being sent to each resident in Pathology, identifying the status of his/her training reports submitted to the AOCP. An up-dated report is sent to the resident upon receipt of each new document.
